Value of MSCA for Egyptian Organisations & Researchers

- Boosting **training and careers** of Egypt's researchers
- Becoming part of a **large network** with Europe and the world
- Broadening Access to **research resources** and amplifying professional contacts
- Building stable and **lasting international collaborations** at institutional level
- Triggering a positive ripple **effect on R&I policies** in participating institutions
- Generate **innovation outputs** (patents, start-ups, etc.)

Egypt's Participation in MSCA So Far

Egypt's Participation in Horizon 2020 MSCA (2014-2020)

- Projects Awarded: 14 projects (86% of them in Staff Exchange)
- Number of participations by Egyptian Organisations: 15 (by 11 organisations)
- Top fields: Engineering and Social Sciences
- Egyptian researchers benefiting from MSCA: 280
- Top Destinations: Italy, Netherlands, Spain

Egypt's Participation in Horizon Europe Calls so far: 2021-2024

- 17 successful projects (+ 2 Coordination & Support Actions):
 - 13 Staff Exchange projects
 - 3 Doctoral Networks
 - 1 Global Post-Doctoral Fellowship
- 21 successful participations by 15 distinct organisations
- Top fields: Social Sciences, Engineering and Life Sciences
- Top Participants: Ain Shams Univ. and American Univ. in Cairo (3 projects each)
- Funds received: **EUR 2.2 M**

Reflecting on Egypt's MSCA Participation

- Egypt advancing remarkably in both Quantity & Quality:
 - ✓ Quantity: Already surpassed H2020 and with 3 more calls to go
 - ✓ Quality: 3 Doctoral Networks vs zero in H2020
- This upwards pattern Will improve even further with Egypt's Association to Horizon Europe
- Non-academic participation, including private sector is low
- No incoming researchers for post-doctoral fellowships in Egypt

WP2026-2027 relevant novelties*

- Relaxing rules on duration of secondments (DN/PF/COFUND)
- Significant simplification for Staff Exchanges eligibility conditions
- Abolishing the “1 month rule” for Staff Exchanges
- Simplify MSCA proposal template for all actions
- Adjusting financial aspects to inflation

Any type of staff involved in R&I activities (researchers, administrative staff, managerial staff, technical staff)

Researchers at any career stage (from doctoral candidates to postdoctoral researchers)

Actively engaged in research and/or innovation activities for at least **1 month** prior at the sending institution*


Each staff member is seconded for a period of **1 to 12 months**

Staff needs to be devoted **full-time** to the action during the secondment

After the secondment, staff should **return to their sending organisation**

* This requirement will be dropped, pending the formal adoption of the MSCA 2026-2027 Work Programme.

Novelties in the 2026-2027 Work Programme



Greater flexibility to support 3-way mobility

- Same-sector secondments now allowed;
international cooperation strongly encouraged
 - Removal of requirement for a non-associated third country (when all partners were in the same sector)
 - Both academic and non-academic sectors must be involved
- Removal of the “one-month rule” before secondment



Skills development

- Enhanced skills development section



Minimum threshold

- New minimum threshold of 3 in each evaluation criteria



Unit cost

- Increased to €2,870 per month

Staff Exchanges - making a difference



WORLD-WIDE
The highest participation of non-EU countries in MSCA



BUSINESS PARTICIPATION
Businesses receive an estimated 30% of the available funding



PATENTS
Significant share of all patents in MSCA actions



SUCCESS RATE
Between 20 & 40% depending on the discipline and on the year







Who can apply?

- ✓ Any Legal Entity worldwide
- ✓ But not all applicants are eligible for funding



Consortia

Min. 3 entities from 3 EU MS/AC
of which 1 from a MS
as beneficiary

- ✓ Universities, research institutions and research infrastructures
- ✓ Businesses including SMEs
- ✓ Other socio-economic actors

No minimum / maximum number of **Associated Partners**

Eligible size and duration

Size

- ✓ Up to **540 person-months** for all type of actions



Duration

- ✓ **Proposal:** max. 48 months for DN and DN-ID
- *incentive for DN-JD **60 months***
- ✓ **Fellowship:** 3 to 36 months for DN and DN-ID
- *incentive for DN-JD **48 months***
- ✓ **Secondments:** worldwide, any sectors, up to 1/3 of the fellowship duration for Standard DN
- incentive for DN-ID and DN-JD **no secondment limitation** – for DN-ID min **50%** in non-academic sector

Other eligibility conditions

All beneficiaries must recruit at least one doctoral candidate, host and supervise in own premises, or use associated partners linked to them to do so

Max. 40% of budget allocated to the same country or to a single international organisation.

Re-submission restrictions for proposals scoring below 80% in the previous year's call

Specific eligibility conditions for Industrial and Joint Doctorates

Eligible researchers



Doctoral candidates

- ✓ **No doctoral degree** at the date of recruitment
- ✓ **Open, merit-based and transparent recruitment** procedure
- ✓ **Enrolled in a PhD** from min 1 EU MS/AC
- ✓ Any nationality
- ✓ fulfill the **MSCA mobility condition**:

DCs must not have resided or carried out their main activity in the country of the recruiting beneficiary for more than 12 months in the 36 months immediately before their recruitment date.


