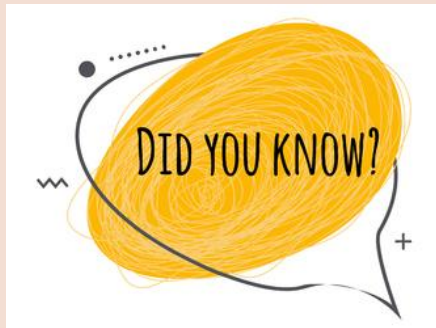

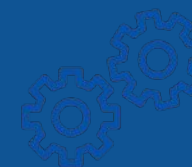

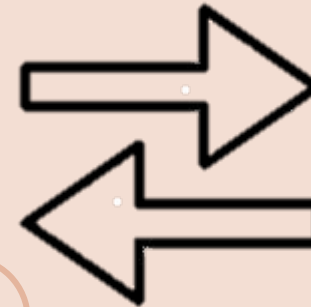

Third Country: Any country that is not an EU Member State (MS) and not a Horizon Europe Associated Country, so it refers to all other non-EU, non-associated countries.

MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships

Lead institutions:

- Single beneficiary
- Associated partners (including a third country host in the case of Global Fellowships)

Eligibility:

- Researchers with a doctoral degree and up to 8 years of post-PhD experience
- Recruited researchers must comply with the following **mobility rule**: they must not have resided or carried out their main activity (work, studies, etc.) in the country of the beneficiary (for European Postdoctoral Fellowships), or the host organisation for the outgoing phase (for Global Postdoctoral Fellowships) for more than 12 months in the 36 months immediately before the call deadline.

Funding:

- Researcher unit cost (living, mobility and family allowance)
- Institutional unit cost (management, research, training and networking costs)

Length:

- Max 24 months for European Fellowships
- Max 36 months for Global Fellowships (incl. a mandatory 12 month return phase)
- Optional additional 6 months for a non-academic placement

MSCA Post-Doctoral Fellowships

MSCA-PF: One Programme, Two Schemes



European Postdoctoral Fellowships

Duration: 12-24 months (+ NAP, if applicable)

Mobility: moving (or recently moved) to or between EU MS/AC

Beneficiary: Host institution in an EU MS/AC**

Global Postdoctoral Fellowships

Duration: 24-36 months (+ NAP, if applicable)

Mobility: 12-24 months **outgoing phase** (Third Country) + **mandatory** 12 month **return phase** to EU MS/AC

Beneficiary: Return phase host in an EU MS/AC

Optional:

- ✓ **Secondment(s):** up to max. ★ of the project duration (EF)* or max. ★ of outgoing phase (GF) to academic/non-academic institution(s), anywhere in the world. Can be split into multiple periods. Must be in the Grant Agreement
- ✓ **Short stays:** limited periods – to anywhere in world – for field work, short research visits, conferences, etc
- ✓ **Non-Academic Placement (NAP):** additional period of up to 6 months in a non-academic institution (in an EU MS/AC) after the end of the standard project duration (for EF) or after the end of return phase (for GF). Must be in the original proposal and in the Grant Agreement

Key Points to Remember about MSCA-PF

The Grant Agreement is a legal contract between REA and your Host Institution

- ✓ You & your host institution are together supposed to deliver the project as proposed
- ✓ Any problems or changes need to be communicated to REA

Your Employment Contract is with your Host Institution, not with REA

- ✓ Your host is your first point of contact in case of questions, problems, etc

You must work full-time and exclusively on your project

- ✓ Unless you have agreed otherwise with your Host & REA (e.g. part-time work, suspension)

Secondments

- ✓ To academic/non-academic institution(s) anywhere in the world
- ✓ Must be indicated in grant agreement

For European Fellowships:

- ✓ Up to max. 1/3 of project duration

For Global Fellowships:

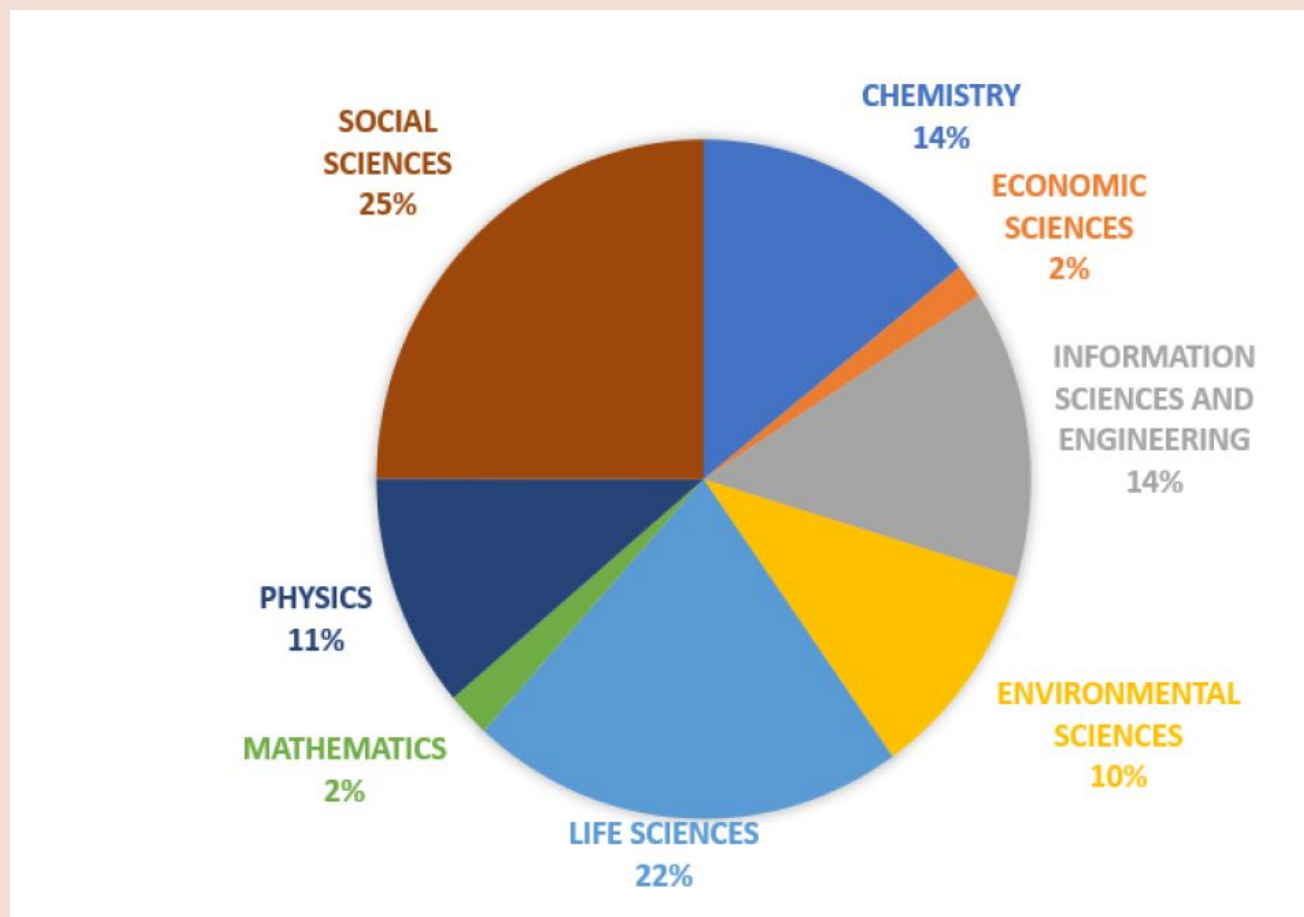
- ✓ Maximum 1/3 of the outgoing phase
- ✓ Not permitted during the return phase

Non-Academic Placements

- ✓ Up to 6 months at non-academic host, after the “normal” end of the project.
- ✓ Cannot be added later (must be in original proposal)

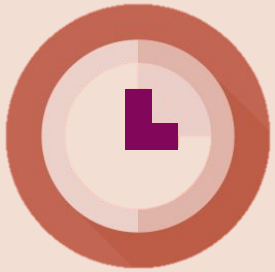

MSCA Choose Europe for Science

Institutions:

- Single beneficiary
- Associated partners

Target:

- Researchers with a doctoral degree

Funding:

- Allowance per person-month in the 1st phase (living + mobility allowance in PF)
- Co-funded by beneficiary with salaries set at attractive levels in the second phase

Length:

- 24 or 36 month 1st phase with EU funding
- 24 month 2nd phase funded entirely by the institution

MSCA Choose Europe for Science pilot 2025

How it works?

- The fellowships last for **max. 5 years**, in two phases:
EU funded phase: 2 or 3 years (phase 1)
Beneficiary funded phase: 2 years (phase 2)
- **Post-project career prospects** for recruited researchers will be considered in the evaluation
- **Choose Europe allowance** (for EU funded phase): 6700€ per person/month
- Pilot **call for organisations** to apply for funding closing on 3rd December 2025

Selected projects are expected to start publishing positions to recruit researchers on Euraxess from **second half of 2026**.

Individual researchers will **apply directly with the host institutions** publishing the vacancy.

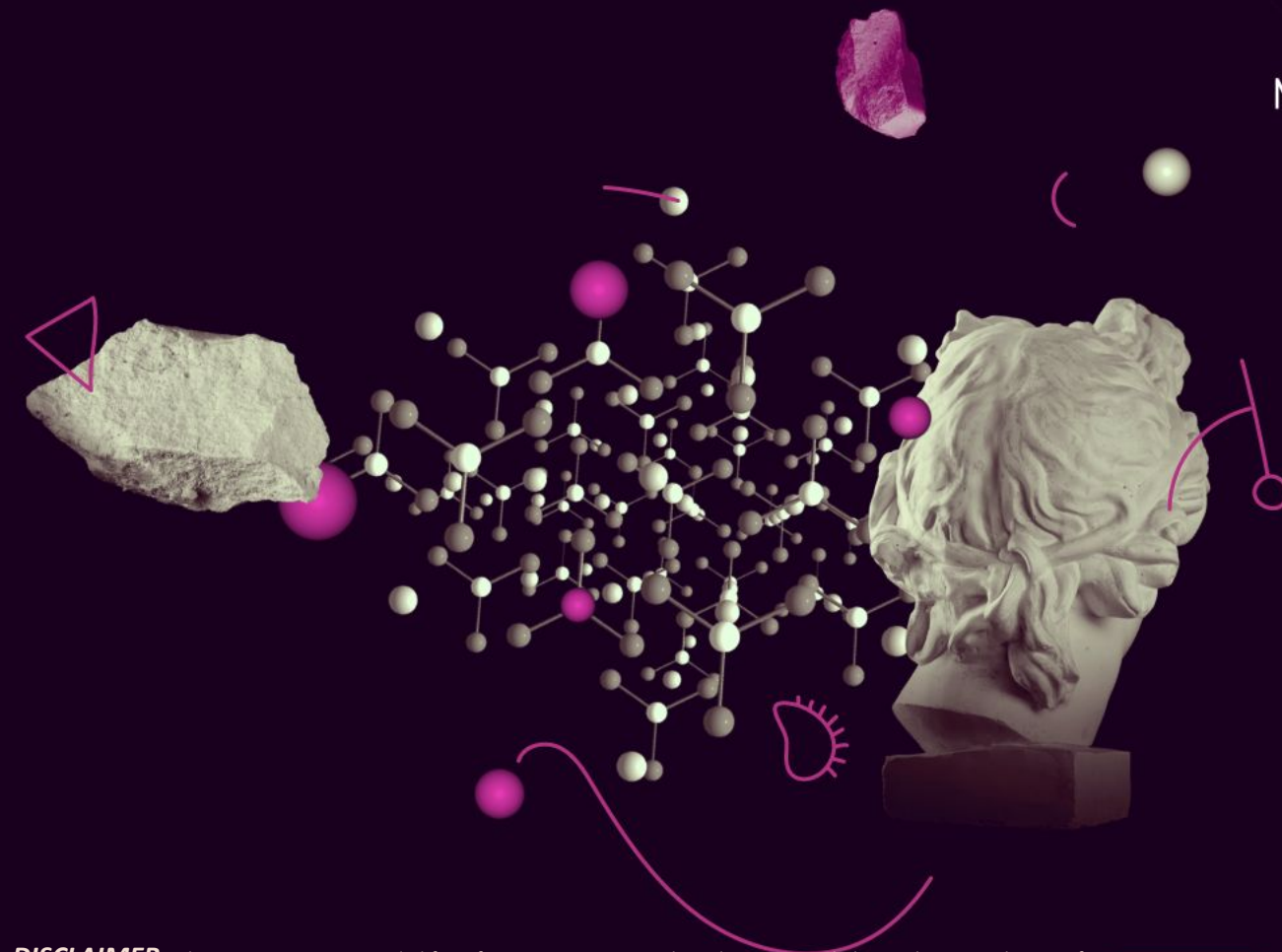

- Where appropriate, **engagement with educational institutions should be sought**

Researchers at Schools activities:

- Activities will allow **researchers to showcase their work and interact with pupils**
- Researchers will engage with teachers and pupils on challenges related to **climate change, sustainable development, health and other European Commission priorities**, such as the European Green Deal or the EU Missions



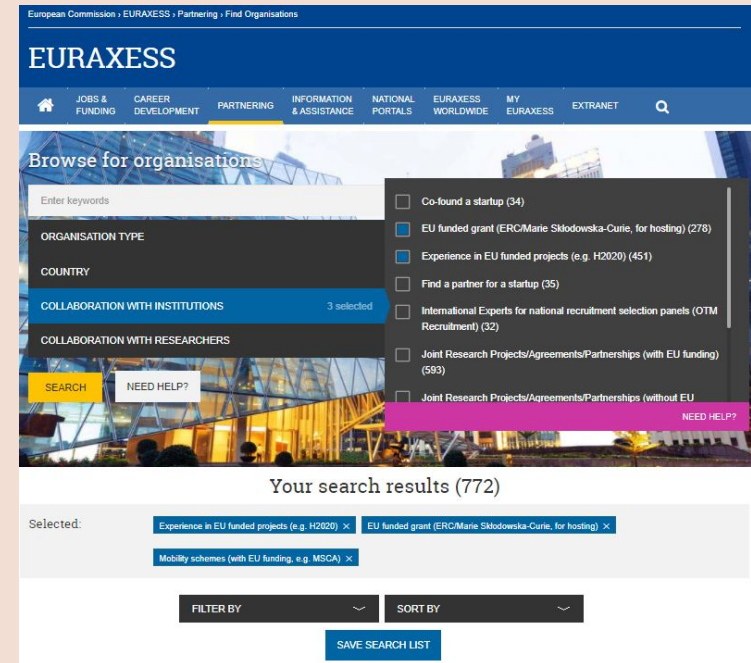
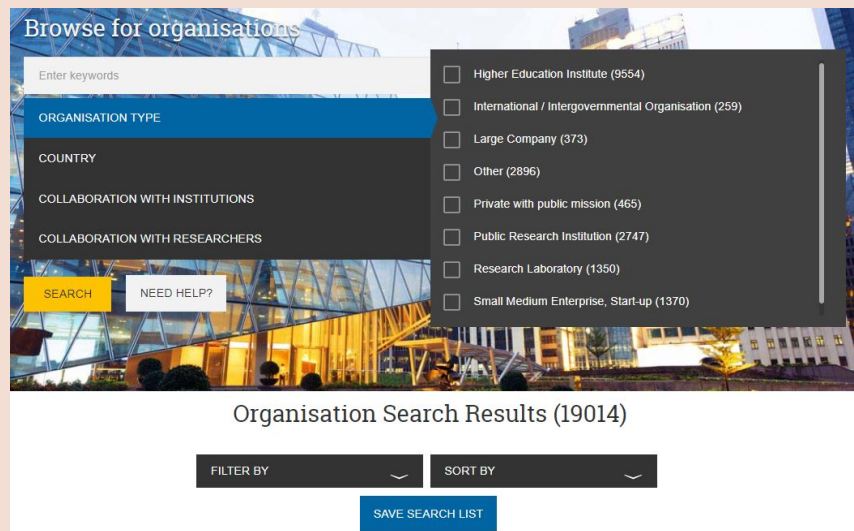
