The official opening ceremony of Horizon Europe Office in Ukraine took place on the basis of the National Research Foundation of Ukraine on December 20, 2023

The Office **provides support** to National Contact Points across Ukraine and strengthens research ties between Ukrainian and European institutions.

The objective of the Office work is to bring Ukraine's participation in the Horizon Europe Programme to a new level.



The Office's **mission** is to unleash the potential of Ukrainian scientists and innovators, along with shaping a society where science and innovation are based on the principles of sustainable environmental, economic and social responsibility.

The target audience of the project falls into the following target groups:

Project coordinator – the National Research Foundation of Ukraine.

Duration – 36 months (01 September 2023 – 31 August 2026).

The main objective of this project is establishing the HEO in Ukraine, which will strengthen the integration of Ukraine in the EU research and innovation Framework Programme Horizon Europe and the European Research Area (ERA). The specific objectives (SO) of the HEO in Ukraine are:

- Establishment of the Horizon Europe Office in Ukraine on the basis of and as integral part of the National Research Foundation of Ukraine (NRFU);



- Establishing professional National Contact Point (NCP) services, facilitation and coordination of the Horizon Europe NCP Network, as well as support to ERA governance structures;

- Promoting Horizon Europe in Ukraine via events and web-based tools;




- Providing advice and analysis on Horizon Europe and UA participation;



Office's specialists regularly provide **training sessions and hold joint events with the NFPs** of the Horizon Europe Programme.


A training plan for the NCPs of the Horizon Europe Programme has been developed. Regular surveys are conducted to identify **training needs**.

Participation of the Office in different types of activities, by year


Map of the flagged regions where the Office held events









INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

The Office database includes **3461** stakeholders from different countries of the world.

Cooperation with representatives of research and scientific institutions in Europe and America; **national coordinators of the COST, Erasmus+, EUREKA, EIT Community Hub in Ukraine, IP Office, the Defense Innovation Office in Kyiv** and other EU programmes for funding science and innovation.

Cooperation with similar Offices of the Horizon Europe Programme in **Norway, France, Austria, Poland, Lithuania, Estonia, Slovakia, Georgia, Czechia and Moldova.**

Ukraine's participation in the EU Framework Programmes for research and innovations



Horizon 2020

During the implementation of Horizon 2020, as of **12.02.2026**, **2841 applications were submitted** by Ukrainian applicants (0.28% of all applications under Horizon 2020), **235 grant agreements were signed** (0.66% of all signed) for the amount of **EUR 48.10 million** (0.07% of all funding). In total, **173 Ukrainian organisations** (0.41% of the total number of organisations) became beneficiaries of Horizon 2020.

The percentage of successful applications in Ukraine under Horizon 2020 is **9.23%**. The average success rate of the participating countries is **15.34%**.



Horizon Europe

During the implementation of Horizon Europe for 2021-2025, as of **12.02.2026**, **2561 applications were submitted** (0.42% of all applications under Horizon Europe), **246 grant agreements were signed** (1.2% of all signed) for the amount of **EUR 64.3 million** (0.13% of all funding). In total, **238 Ukrainian organisations** (0.75% of all participating organisations) became beneficiaries of Horizon Europe.

The percentage of successful applications in Ukraine under Horizon Europe is **13.00%**. The average success rate of the participating countries is **18.94%**.

Statistics on Ukrainian participation in the Horizon Europe Programme before and after the Office began operating

September 2023

During the implementation of Horizon Europe, as of **01.09.2023**, **968 applications were submitted** by Ukrainian applicants (0.28% of all applications under Horizon 2020), **80 grant agreements were signed** (0.39% of all signed) for the amount of **EUR 22.27 million** (0.04% of all funding). In total, **89 Ukrainian organisations** (0.28% of the total number of organisations) became beneficiaries of Horizon Europe.

The percentage of successful applications in Ukraine under Horizon Europe is **19.1%**. The average success rate of the participating countries is **16.27%**.




February 2026

During the implementation of Horizon Europe for 2021-2025, as of **12.02.2026**, **2561 applications were submitted** (0.43% of all applications under Horizon Europe), **246 grant agreements were signed** (1.2% of all signed) for the amount of **EUR 64.3 million** (0.13% of all funding). In total, **238 Ukrainian organisations** (0.75% of all participating organisations) became beneficiaries of Horizon Europe.

The percentage of successful applications in Ukraine under Horizon Europe is **13.00%**. The average success rate of the participating countries is **18.94%**.

Ukraine's participation in projects, the number of signed grants and the amount of EU funding received per year within the Horizon Europe Programme



The number of projects launched during the year coordinated by Ukrainian participants




The number of projects coordinated by Ukrainian participants by Programme components


